As another election year is underway the same concerns that have affected the senior population in past elections surface once again. Historically, it seems that four areas have been involved. First is the topic of health. With this year's issue centering on the Medicare prescription drug legislation that was passed at the end of the 2003 Session of the 108th Congress. The second topic is Income Security. The center of this issue is the "privatization" of Social Security – the possibility of allowing people to invest Social Security funds in private investment accounts and the possible reduction of benefits in the future. Third, is Long-Term Care. The sky rocketing costs of long-term care is certainly a problem for seniors who have a critical need for such care, and the service providers who are trying to provide it affordably. Finally, the topic of Community Service. This year's emphasis is housing and transportation both important issues that have special significance here in San Diego. As in the past Republicans, Democrats, and Independents alike will debate all of these issues because that is what takes place during an election year. Many different outcomes are possible. What must not be forgotten through all the political rhetoric and resulting legislation are the Seniors whose lives are directly affected.

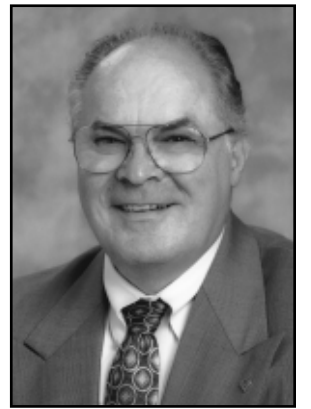
